Health Testing
<ul> <li>□ Cardiac clearance for both parents</li> <li>□ Hip evaluation (OFA preferred) for both parents</li> <li>□ Thyroid testing for both parents</li> <li>□ Eye clearance for both parents</li> <li>□ Can provide documentation or reasonable explanation for any missing clearances</li> </ul>
Basic Breeding Standards
<ul> <li>□ Allows you to visit and meet the dogs</li> <li>□ Written contract with health guarantee</li> <li>□ Lifetime support and return policy</li> <li>□ Good reputation in Great Dane community</li> <li>□ Asks questions about your family and experience</li> </ul>

# **Quality Indicators (Should Have Most)**

## **Breeding Program Excellence**

□ Active in breed community (dog shows, breed clubs, events) □ Can clearly explain their breeding philosophy □ Explains why they chose this specific pairing □ Can discuss pedigrees and both parents knowledgeably □ Has mentors or co-breeding relationships □ Multiple years of experience with Great Danes □ Limited number of breeds (preferably only Great Danes) □ Limited litters (1-3 litters per year)
Communication & Support
<ul> <li>□ Professional website with breeding philosophy</li> <li>□ Responds professionally within reasonable time</li> <li>□ Clear health testing information posted</li> <li>□ References from other families available</li> <li>□ Explains their puppy selection process clearly</li> <li>□ Provides clear information about costs and contracts</li> </ul>
Puppy Care Standards
<ul> <li>□ Detailed socialization program including ENS (Early Neurological Stimulation)</li> <li>□ Helps match puppies to families based on temperament and goals</li> <li>□ Provides ongoing care guidance and puppy package</li> <li>□ Clean, safe facilities during visit</li> <li>□ Healthy, well-socialized adult dogs</li> <li>□ Can meet puppies and dam (plus discuss sire knowledgeably if unavailable)</li> </ul>
Your Specific Goals
$\square$ Breeder has experience with your goals (showing/dog sports/therapy work, etc.) $\square$ Can provide guidance for your interests
Note: Great Danes are not suitable for mobility service work or as heavy running companions due to joint concerns.

Red Flags
□ Always has puppies available □ Won't allow facility visits □ Can't provide health clearances □ No health guarantee or return policy □ Doesn't ask questions about your family □ Pressure tactics or "limited time" offers □ Sells to pet stores or puppy brokers □ Breeds multiple breeds extensively □ Poor reputation in breed community □ Focus on "rare" colors or "Euro lines" over standard/health/temperament
